

My name is Jason Wilson, a paramedic in the Logistics Department for Kanawha County Emergency Ambulance Authority (KCEAA), based in Charleston, WV. We have had our MOGS 100 for about 5 years now; it has paid for itself several times over already and has decreased the overall budget of the company due to not buying oxygen from a vender. With the system we have in place we have decreased back injuries from not having to lift oxygen bottles in and out of our ambulances all the time, as well as decreasing out of service times for our units with regards to refilling the oxygen. The service we have received from OGSi has been great, from the initial setup and installation, routine care and maintenance to emergency service when we took a direct lightning strike in 2012 in which a service tech came to our location to get the machine back up and running again. We are very satisfied with our MOGS 100; we have a fleet of 47 ambulances and run nearly 70,000 calls a year, we are able to maintain the entire fleet with this one machine.
